Crystal Meth Destined for Amarillo **Seized by New Mexico State Police**

Albuquerque – State Police Officers out of Albuquerque were patrolling Interstate 40 in the afternoon hour, when an officer observed a traffic infraction that led them to the seizure of Crystal Methamphetamines.

While patrolling Interstate 40, officers observed an eastbound vehicle weaving in and out of its lane near mile post 134. The vehicle was a 2001 GMC pick-up truck driven by 36 y.o. Abraham Bobadilla-Campos of Mexico. The stop and subsequent search of the vehicle led to nineteen bundles wrapped in plastic. The bundles contained crystal methamphetamines, which weighed in at approximately 28 pounds, street valued at approximately \$420,000.00.

Abraham Bobadilla-Campos and 26 y.o. Bianca Sanchez-Caballero, also of Mexico, were arrested and will be charged federally by the United States Attorney's Office. The crystal meth was from California and was destined for Amarillo, Texas.
